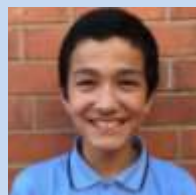

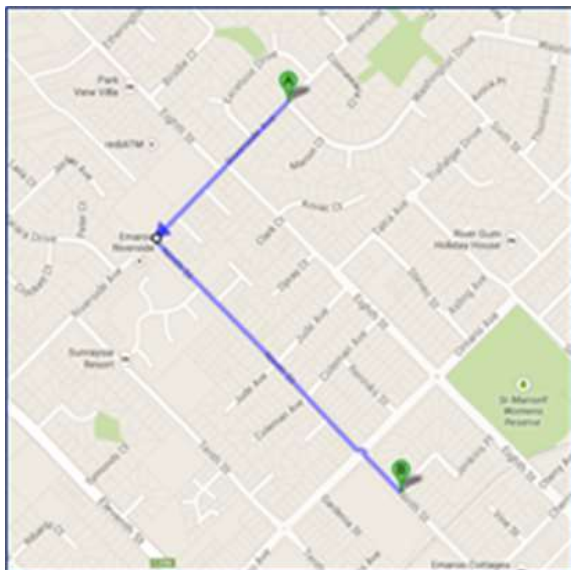

Amber scattered a packet of 24 Smarties on her desk to see how many blue ones there were. Below is a list of what was in the packet. Shade them as shown:

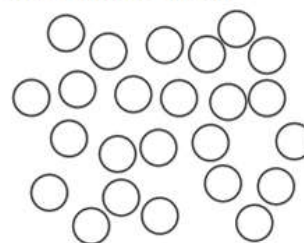
